Florence Nightingale

Birth: 12th May 1820, Florence, Italy.

Famous for: Going to the Crimean War, and nursing wounded soldiers. She saved many lives, along with her team of nurses.

What she did: made hospitals cleaner, by introducing proper cleaning methods. Showed the world that trained nurses and hygienic conditions helped the sick to recover. She wrote a book, opened a hospital, and was awarded a medal.

Mary Seacole

Birth: 1805 in Jamaica
Famous for: Going to the
Crimean War to nurse sick and
wounded British soldiers. She
founded the British Hotel.
What she did: She went onto
the battlefields, and gave the
wounded food, blankets, clean
clothes and kindness. The
soldiers called her Mother
Seacole. She did what few
other women did in the
Victorian Age, and travelled,
ran a business, went to war

and risked her life to help

others.

John Snow

Birth: 15th March 1813
Famous for: He was an English physician, and an expert in medical hygiene.
What she did: He helped to save lots of lives in Soho in London in 1854 when he traced the source of a cholera outbreak. He also provided anaesthetic to Queen Victoria when she gave birth to two of her children.
